## Foreword

The immigrants listed in this volume were protestant refugees from Europe who came to South Carolina on the encouragement of an Act passed by the General Assembly of the Colony on July 25, 1761, called the Bounty Act. A copy of the Act is not available. It is referred to in the published Statutes of South Carolina as follows:

"AN ACT for repealing an Act passed the seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty-two, for altering and amending the sixth and seventh paragraphs of the Act commonly called the General Duty Act, and for appropriating and applying three-fifths of the tax appropriated and applyed by the said sixth and seventh paragraphs of the said last mentioned Act as is hereinafter mentioned. (Passed July 25, 1761. The original too much torn to be copied.)"

The explanation or opinion of the Attorney General (page 116 of this volume) shows that it was a broadening of earlier immigration laws, for the special benefit of these religious refugees. Applicants had to have certificates showing that they were protestants and entitled to receive the benefits allowed by the new Bounty Act, which was evidently modified and renewed from time to time.

These immigrants contributed greatly to the religious, social and political development of the Colony, and many of them became soldiers and patriots of the Revolutionary War.

Looking over these lists we find the forbears of some of the most prominent families of the state; and doubtless the forbears of a great many prominent citizens of other states.

In compiling this volume great care has been taken to reproduce the original records (as nearly as is possible) as they were entered in the Council Journals, and therefore no effort has been made to correct spelling, punctuation or other clerical errors. Frequently a family name, or the name of an individual is spelled two or more ways, so that further research and study of the family history would be necessary to determine the correct spelling. In making up the index for this volume a few obvious errors in the spelling of names have been noted in

parenthesis so that the names might take their proper alphabetical place.

The records have been compared several times with the original entries, and the work is generally accurate, although the old handwriting proved difficult in a very few instances.

The compiler hopes that this volume will prove of great interest and help to genealogists and students of South Carolina history.

Grateful acknowledgment is due to Miss Elizabeth Fearn Eldridge whose encouragement and financial assistance has made the publication of this work possible.

Council Journal 33, page 311. Meeting of 15th. December 1767.

The following Petitions for Warrants of Survey on the Bounty were presented and read AND the Bounty allowed by the Act of Assembly passed the 25th. July 1761

Henry Gibson 100 acres in Granville County

Robert Spence 100 acres in Granville County

ORDERED that the Secretary do prepare Warrants of Survey accordingly and that the Clerk do issue his Certificates to the public Treasurer to pay them the Bounty agreeable to the directions of the said Act.

Council Journal 33, page 312-325. Meeting of 22nd. December 1767.

The Clerk reported to the Board that in pursuance of His Excellency the Governor's directions he had been on board the ship Earl of Denegal Duncan Ferguson Master and had sworn the Irish passengers arrived in her to their being Protestants and having come over on the encouragement and bounty given by the Act of the General Assembly passed the 25th. day of July 1761 agreeable to a List he had delivered in at the Board Petitions praying to be allowed the said Bounty from the undermentioned persons were then presented and read
