Matthew 1:18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit.

**Perspective.** Economic times are certainly trying today as we look back at the past few months. The retail world got positively paranoid and gave up on marketing for Halloween and began

p u t t i n g Christmas paraphernalia out weeks before October 31. Yes, "Christmas in October!" But we have

lived through years when Christmas decorations have started showing up in September, and of course, there are stores that focus on "Christmas in July!"

God's Planning. We don't think that Jesus was born in December, but the church has marked the birth of Christ using an old date of celebration from the pagan world. What was a pagan holiday has become a holy day which acknowledges God's

work in the world. The Book of Romans reminds us that Christmas did not just happen. We could trace the promise of the Savior deep into the Old Testament prophecies and find its roots back in God's promise to Adam and Eve that there would be a Savior to save people from sin. The prophets revealed that the Savior would "redeem" mankind. St. Paul tells us that the whole universe was waiting for restoration through Jesus Christ, and that we are being restored through His work in Heaven at this time, but the process commenced with the birth of Christ and His sacrifice on the cross.

God's Immediate Lead-Time. John the Baptist was a child of promise, just like Jesus. We do not appreciate John the Baptist, because his ministry was overshadowed by the Lord. Luke reveals that the wonderful birth of John was not without recognition. Little did the people recognize that John was to be the forerunner of the Lord, preparing the way. But, check the record here—John was just a few months older than Jesus! Yet, John was busy in ministry before the Lord began His earthly ministry. We do not know for how long, but the evidence suggests that he was probably ministering years before Christ enters the picture with His disciples and ministry. John's lead-time in preparing people for the coming of the Christ was crucial to the success of Jesus' ministry in some way that we just do not fully understand.

A Promise Fulfilled. We are all familiar with the Lord's coming to earth. Yes, the Lord came from somewhere else, and He came to earth in a miraculous way into a fully human body. Just as our Heavenly Father fathered the First Adam, God Himself is involved with the Second Adam (the human Jesus Christ) as father. We live in a time when people want to humanize Jesus and deny His divinity. Matthew reminds us that God is involved. Christ is no accident, regardless of where you put His birthday. The Bible with its prophets

and with God's own voice within its pages, affirms that Jesus Christ is not just another human, but very special even as the First Adam of Eden was a first-of-a-kind creation.

**Prayer for Christmas.** Times are difficult for many people this Christmas season. As we begin Advent and celebrate Christmas in just a few short weeks, lets pray for our friends and family and for our nation and its people, that all may know the Lord Jesus Christ for Who He is. Pray for a friend or neighbor to join you in worship this Christmas as we recognize the fulfillment of God's great plan of salvation for mankind.
